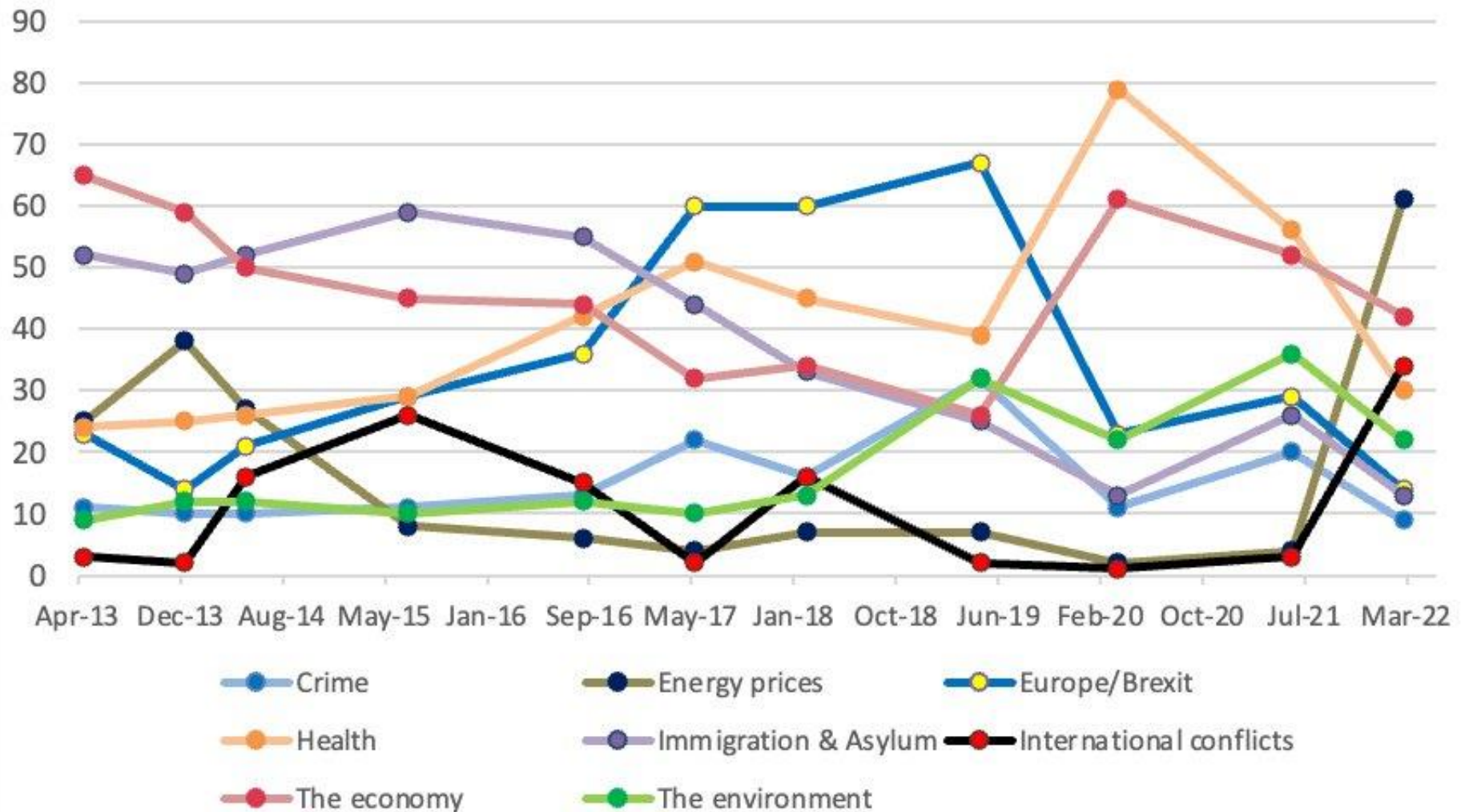

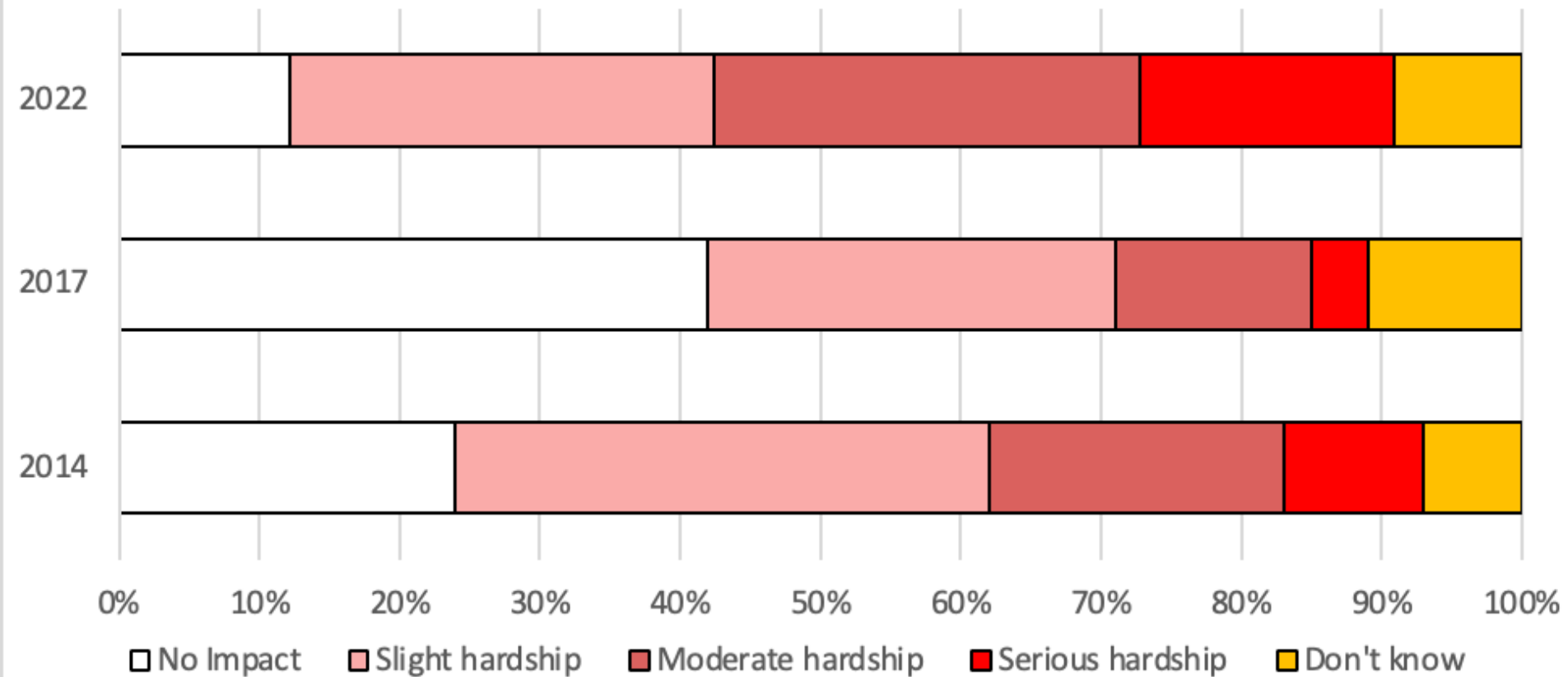

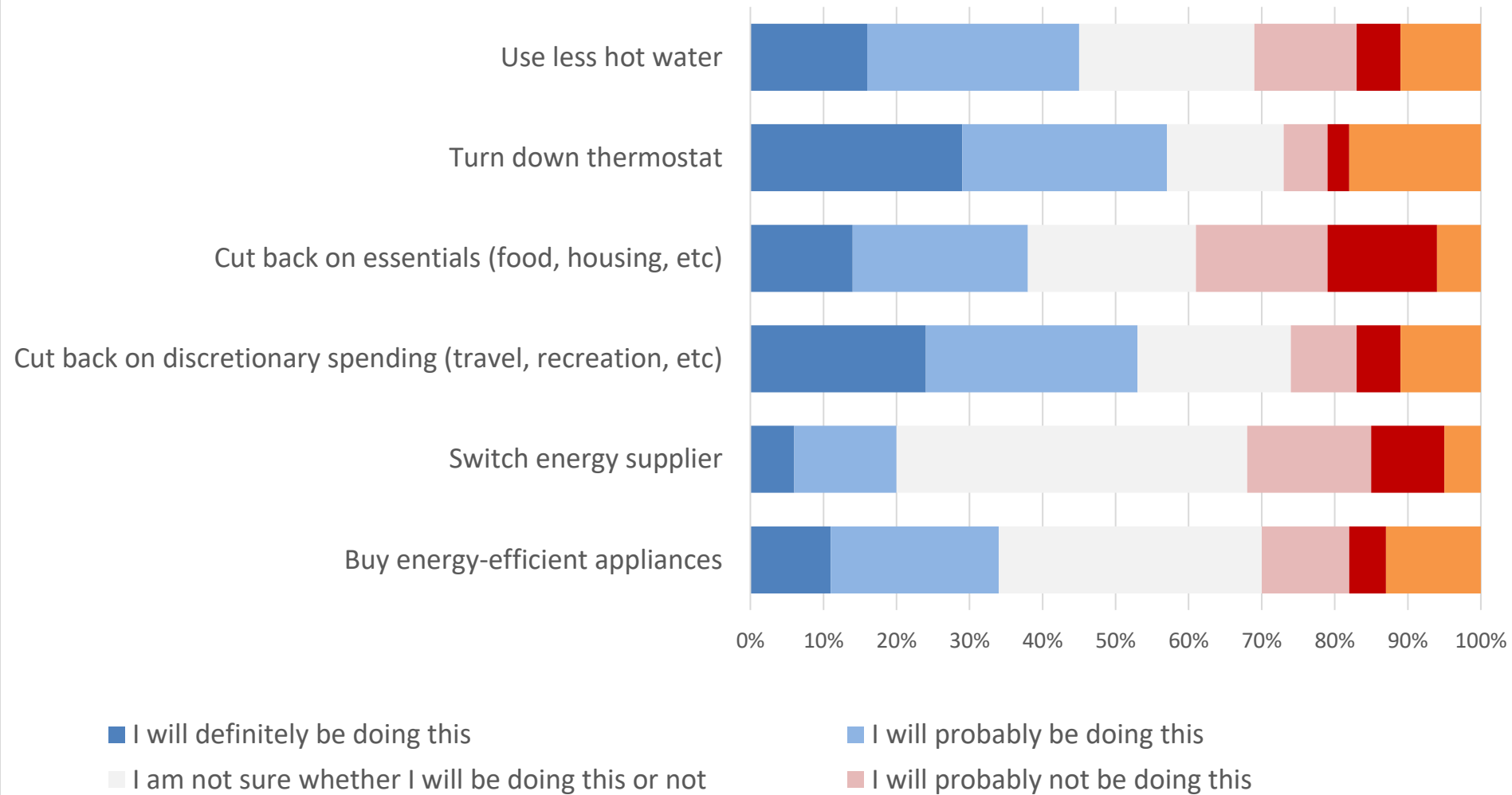


Impact of energy bills on household financial situation

Individual response to price rises



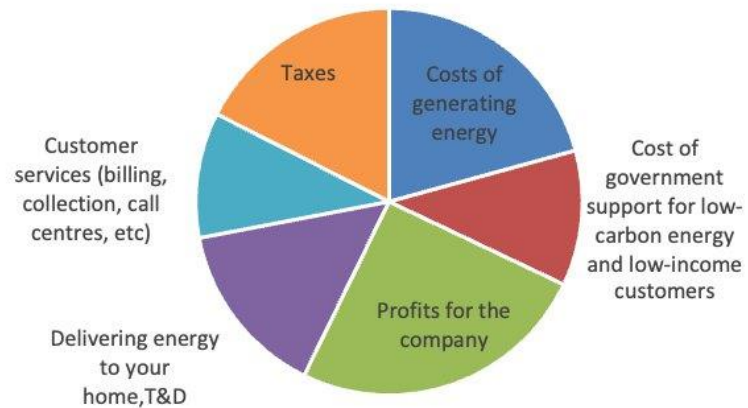
How would you assign responsibility for these price increases?

Responsibility for Price Rise

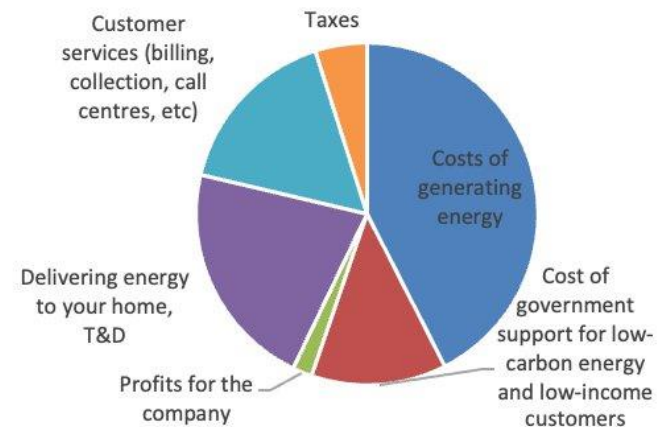


Perceptions of costs on energy bills versus reality

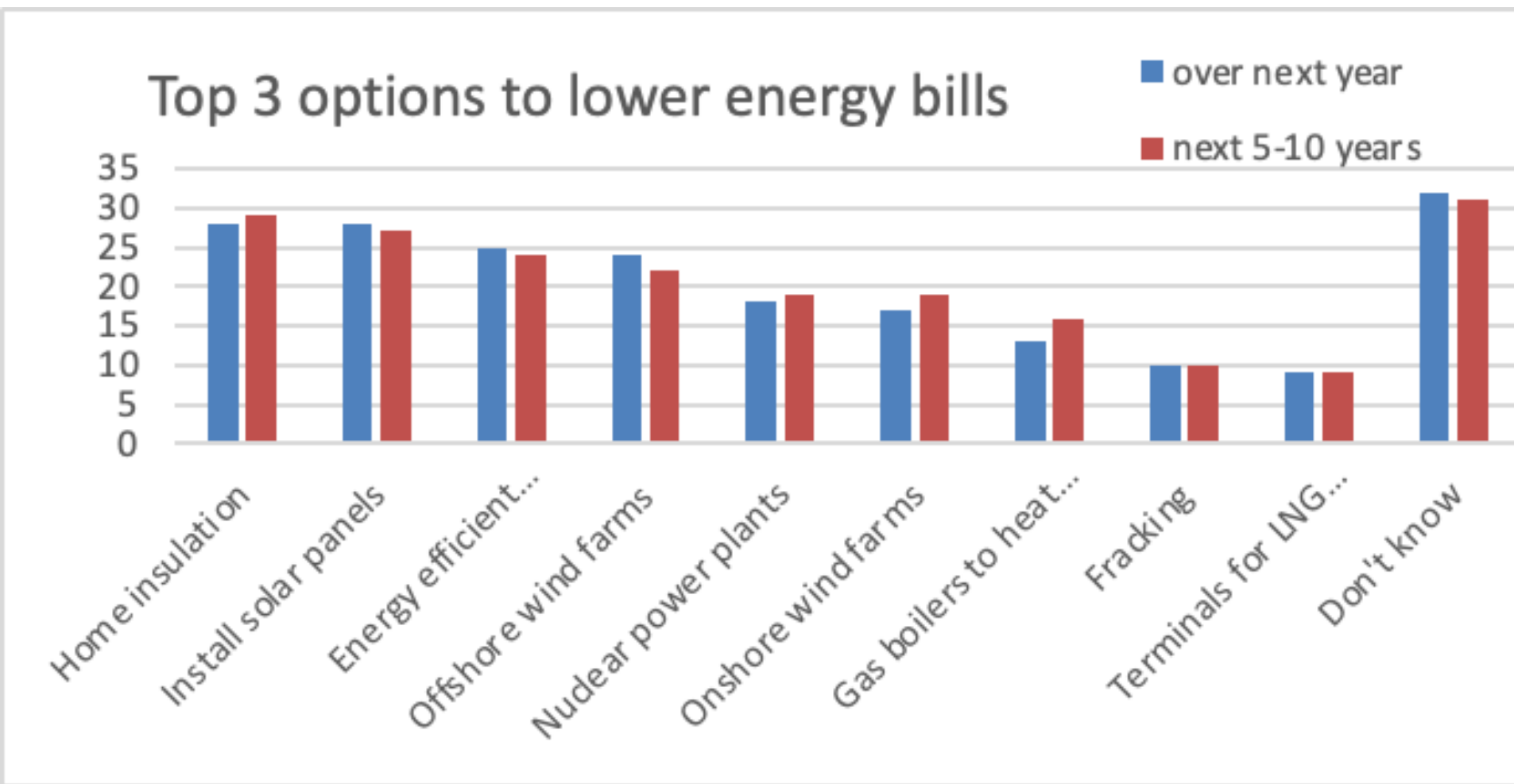
Estimated Distribution of costs on consumer bills



Actual costs for price capped DD Dual-fuel customer (Winter 21/22 via Ofgem)

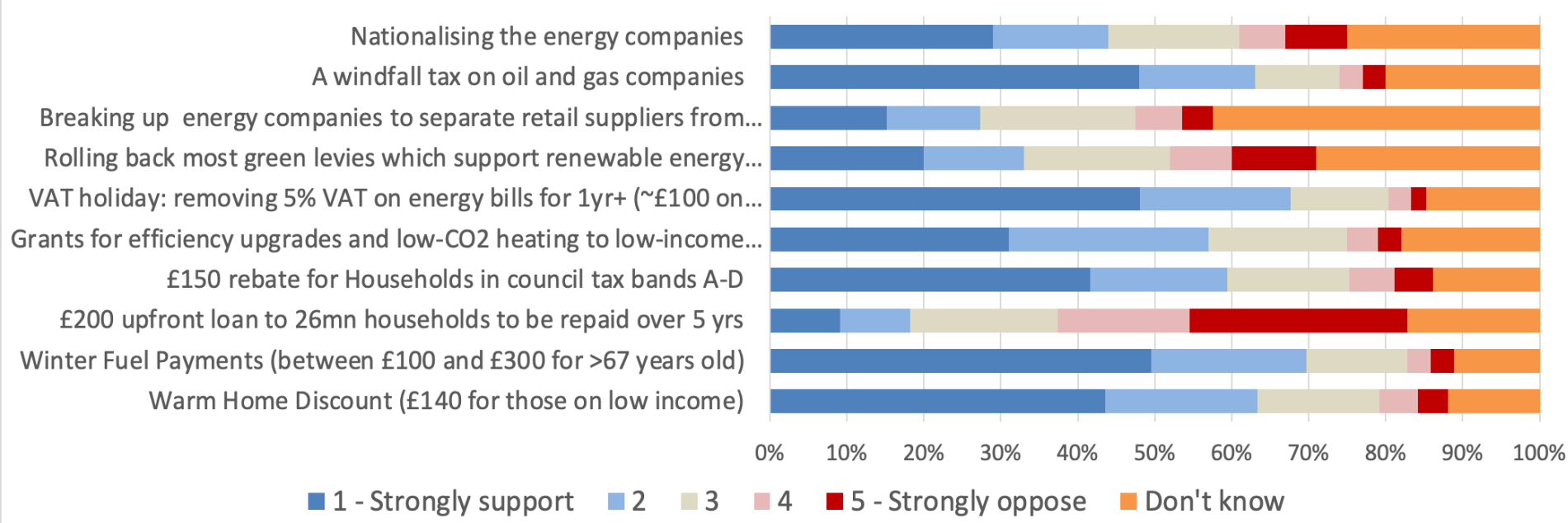


Which will have the greatest impact on your energy bills?

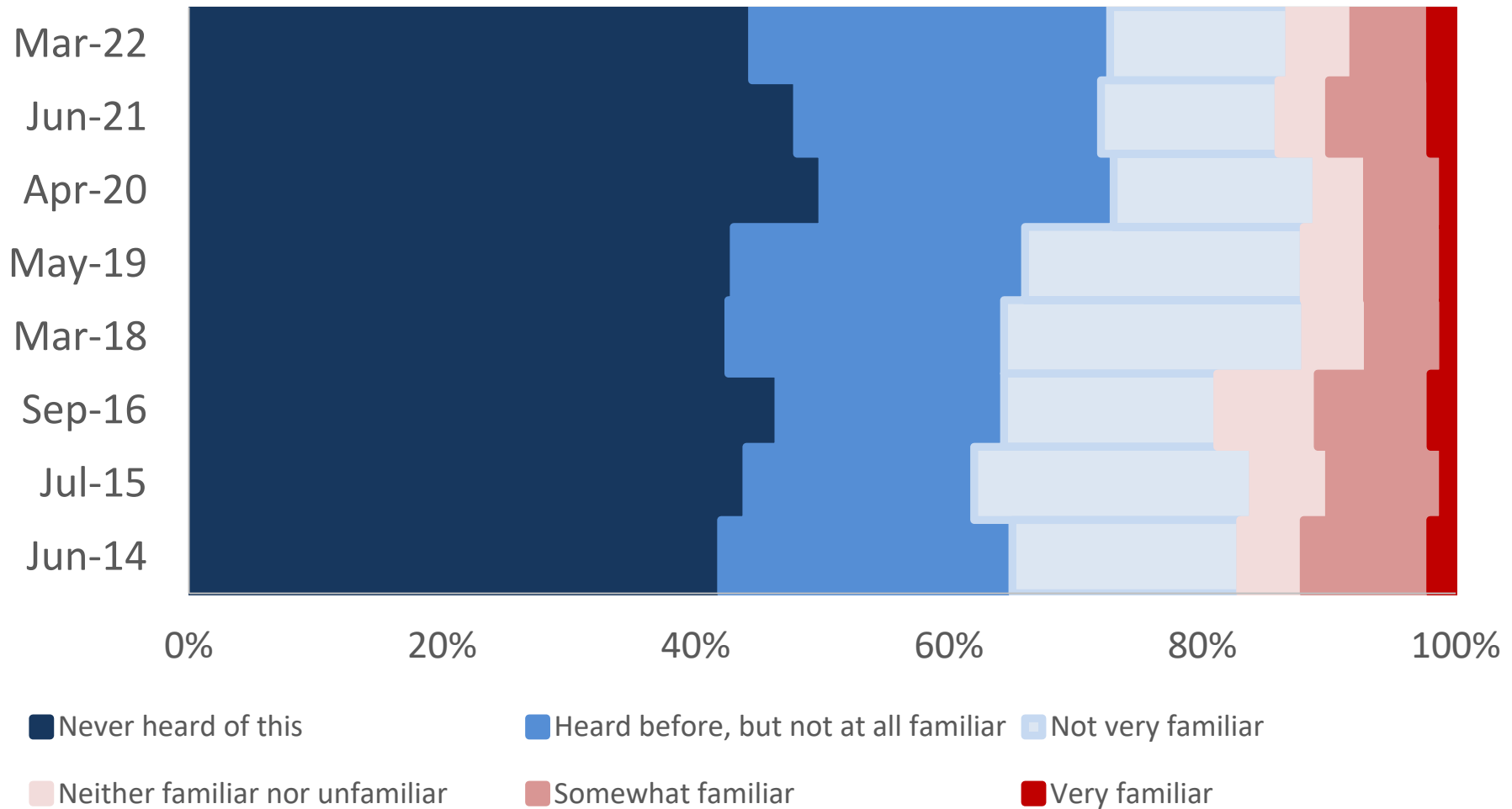

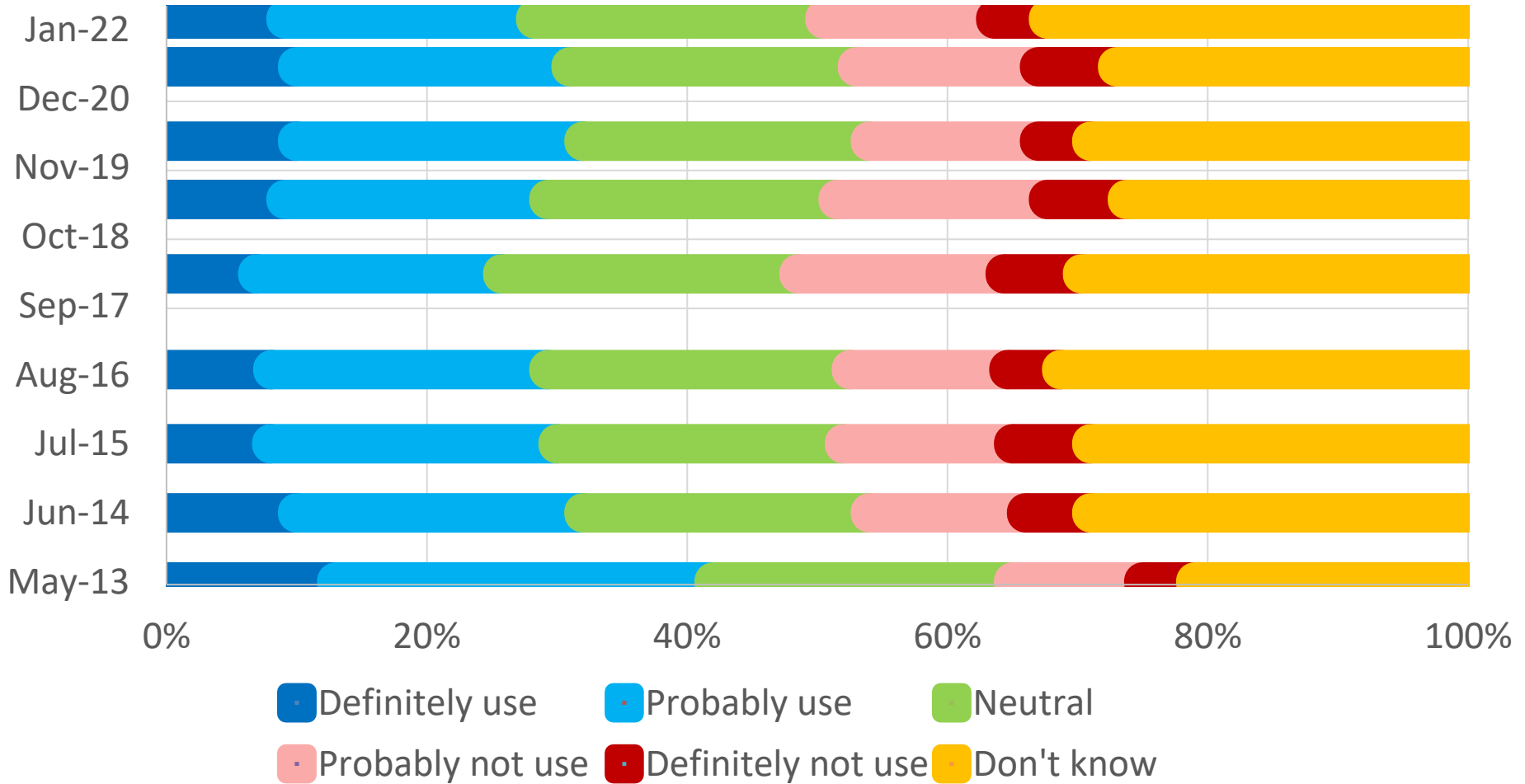

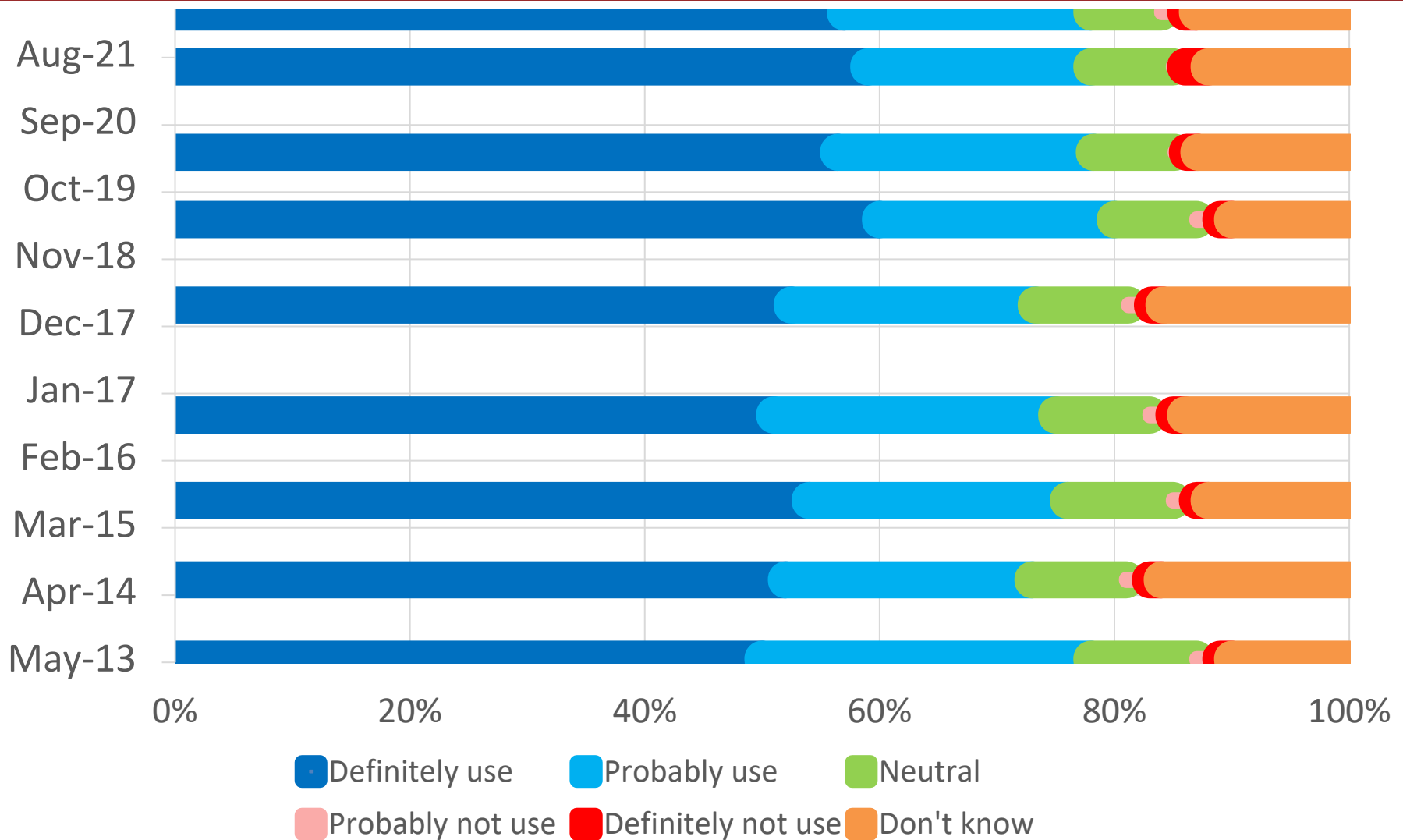

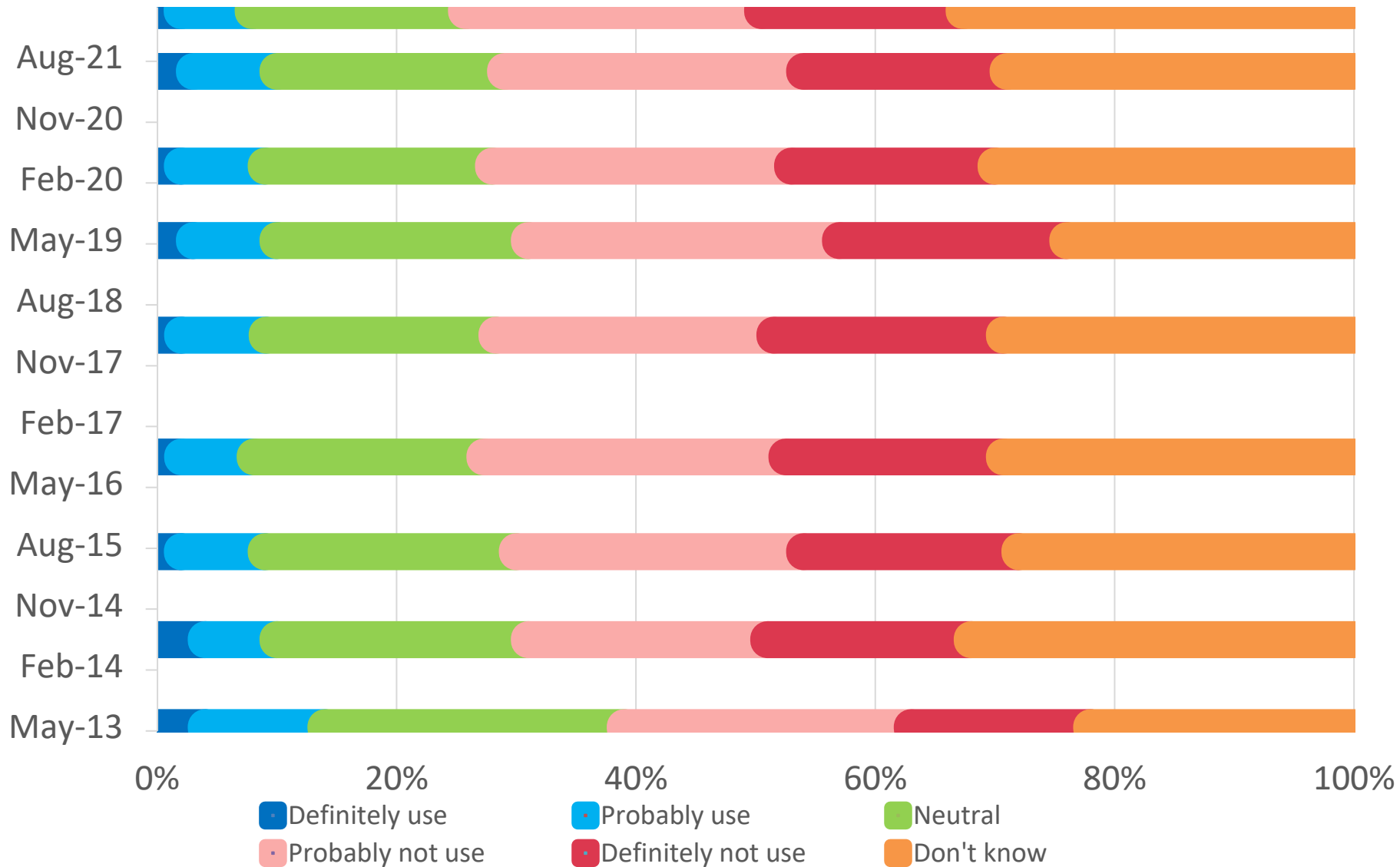

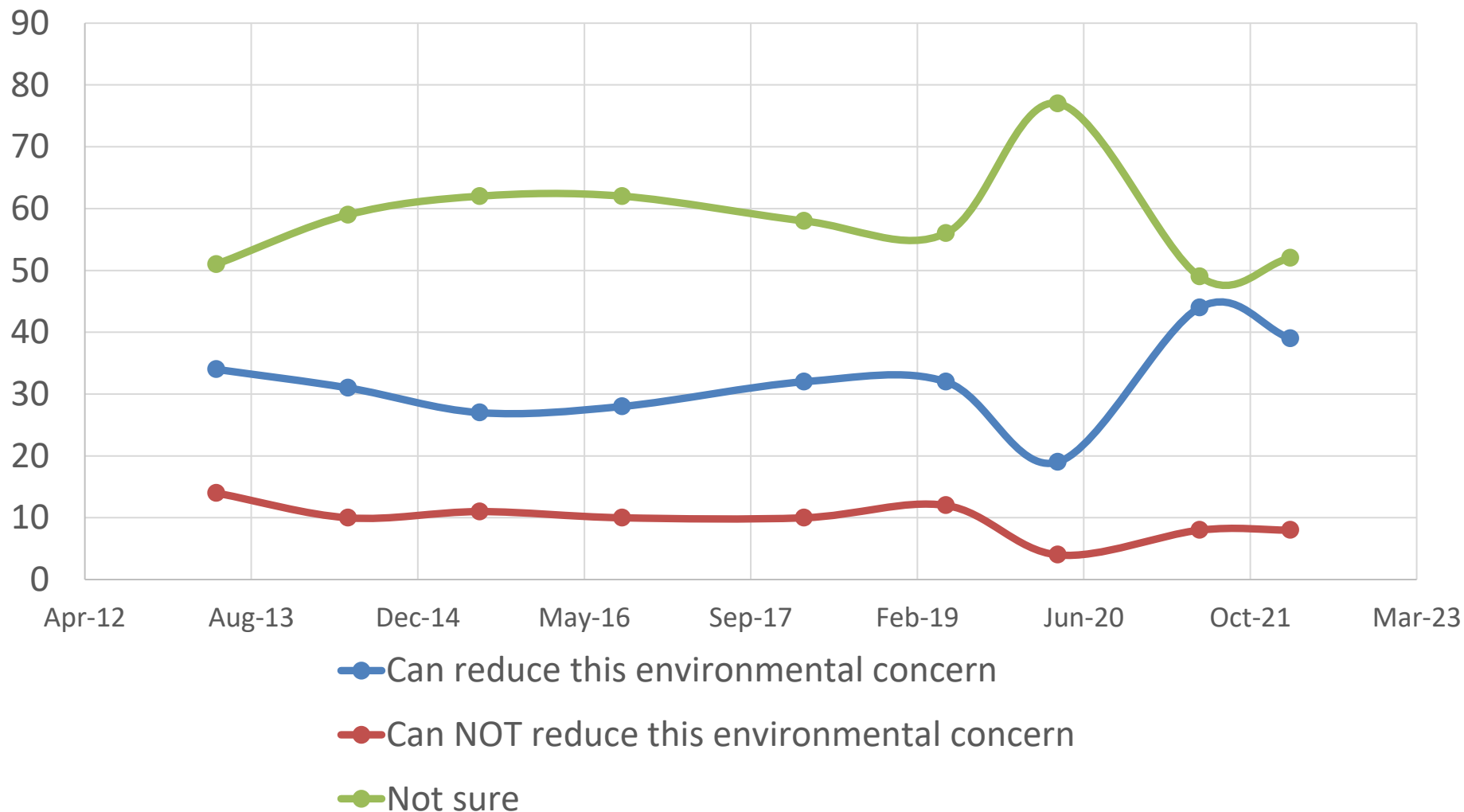

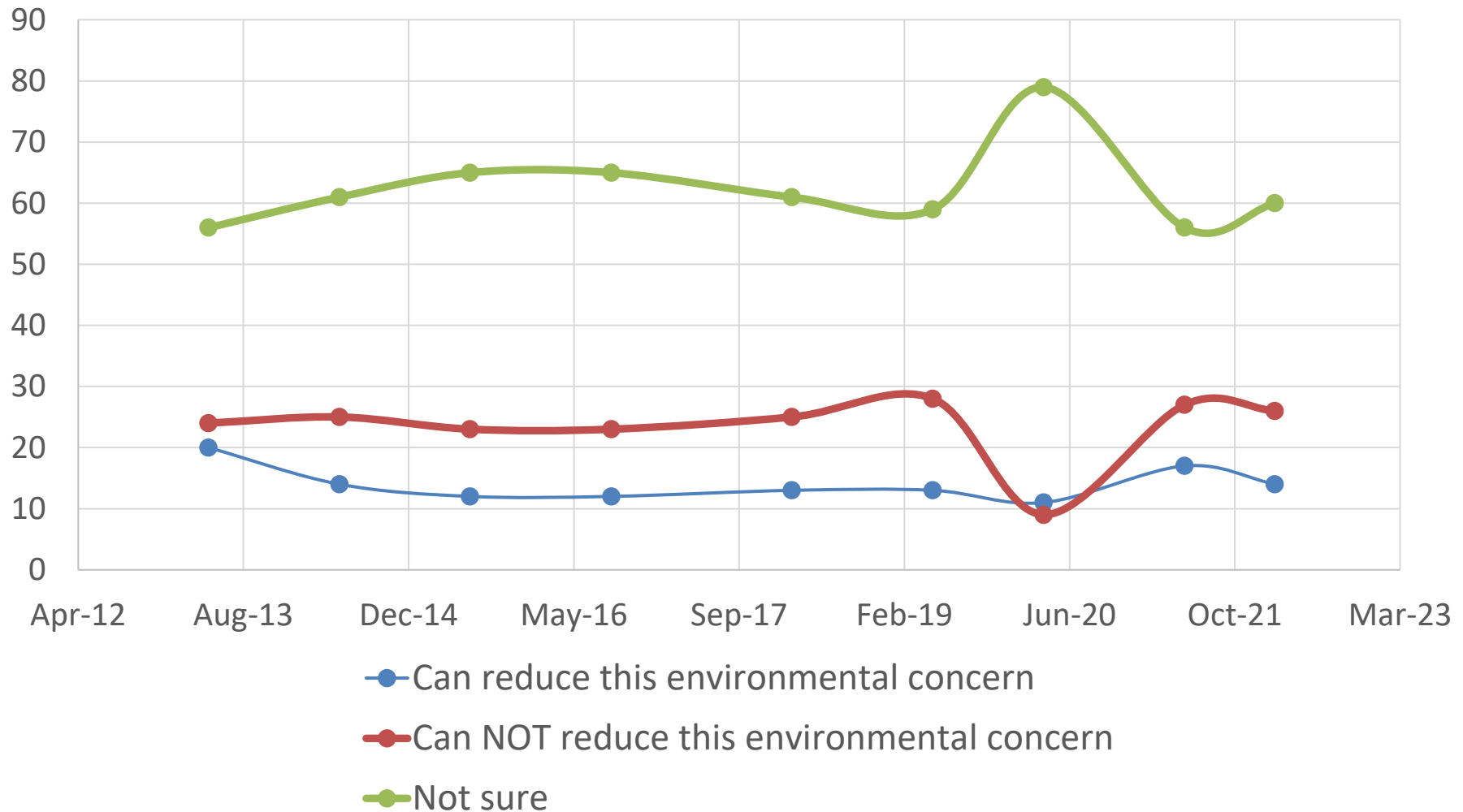

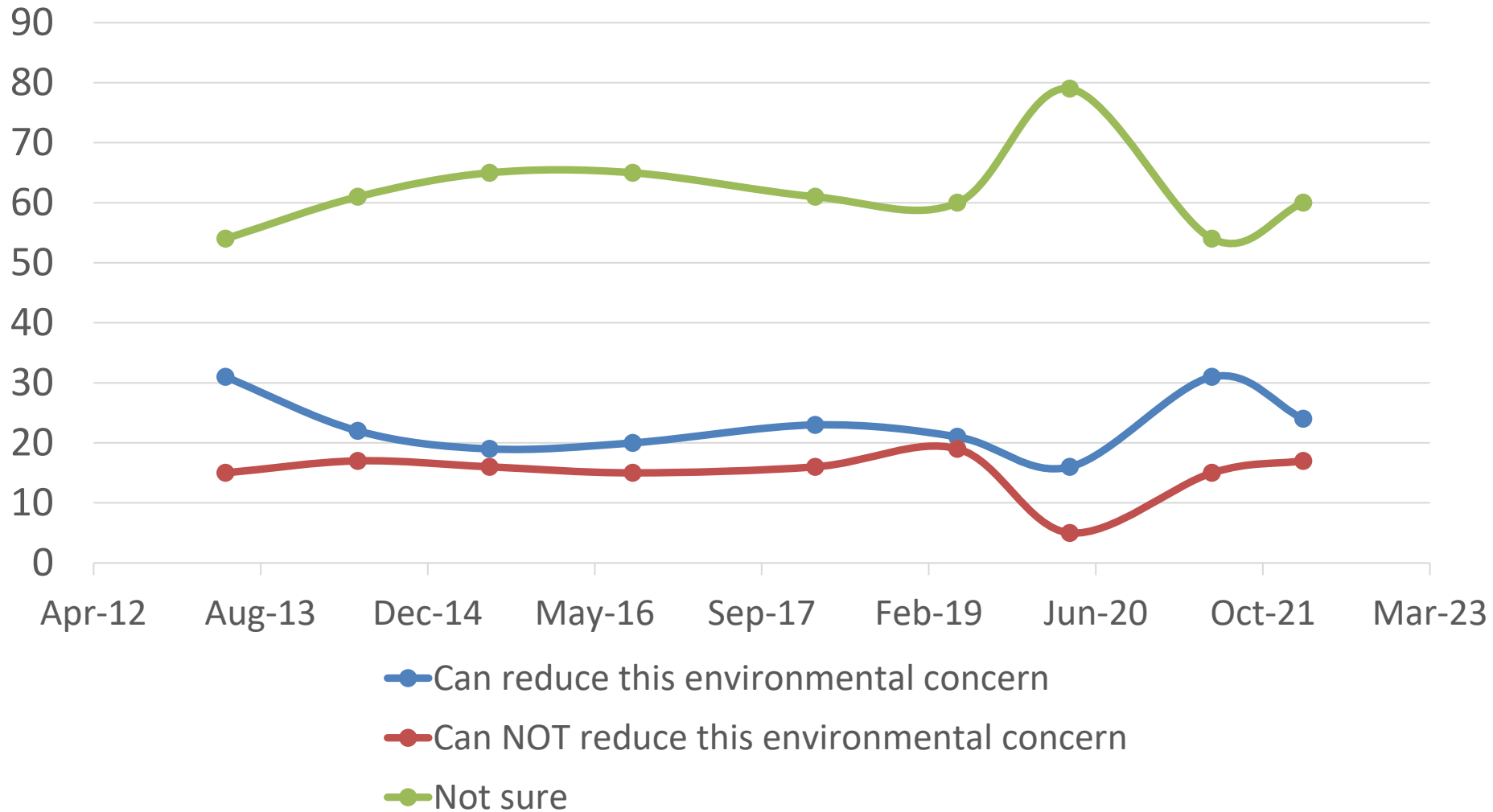

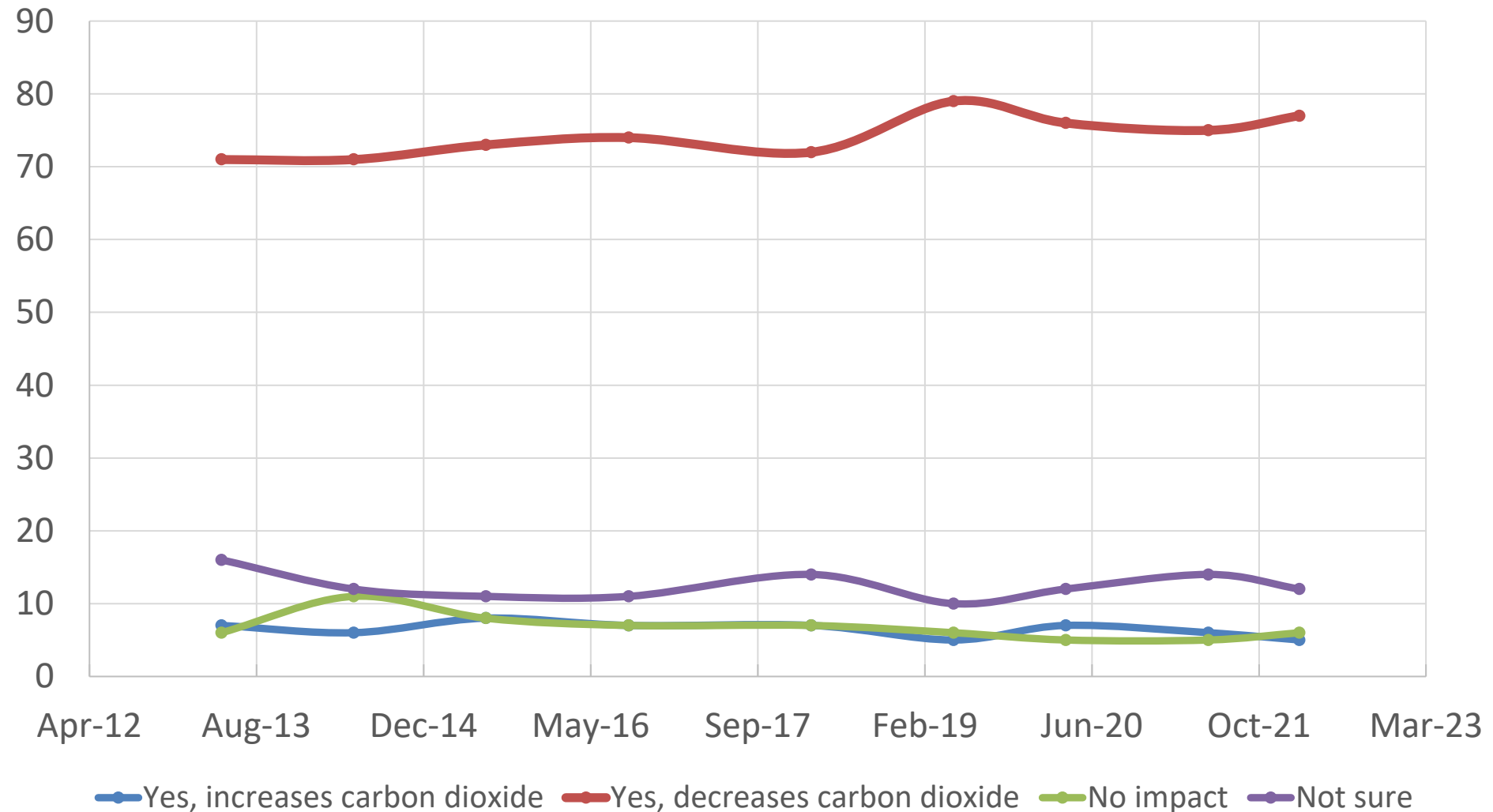
Toxic Waste



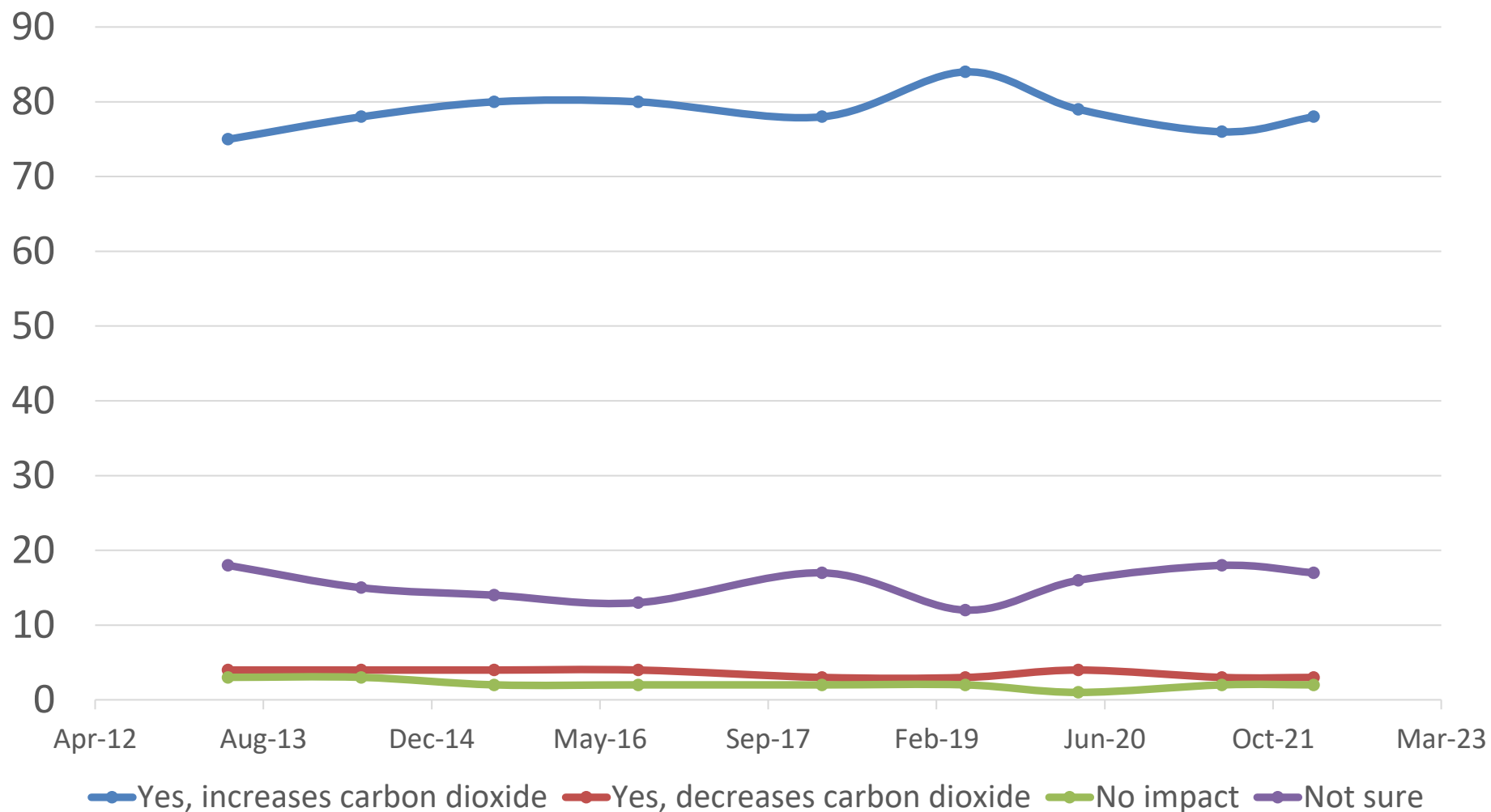
Ozone Depletion



Planting Trees

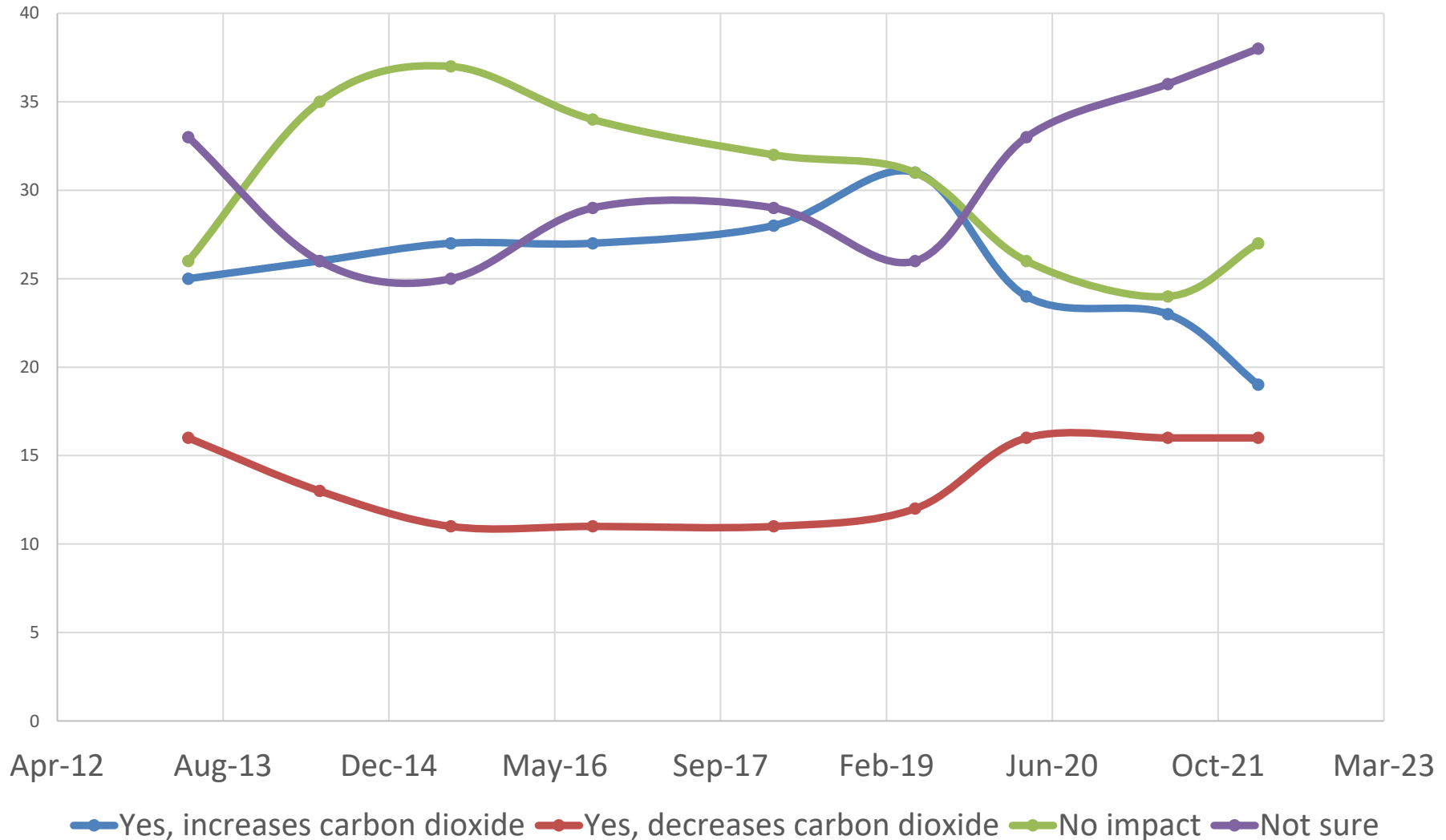


Factories (e.g., steel mills)
