Summary of aims and objectives of the policy/funding activity/event	<p>The aim of this call is for CCS research projects that support the UK Government’s net-zero objectives including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Supporting the Government’s net-zero objectives</li> <li>• Research linked to the priorities identified in the UKCCSRC industry and policy led ‘what are our research needs’ workshops</li> <li>• Research not already funded by the Industrial Decarbonisation Research and Innovation Centre, IDRIC (see <a href="https://idric.org/research-programme/">https://idric.org/research-programme/</a> for details of current IDRIC projects. IDRIC Wave 2 funding now confirmed and remainder to be funded through a rolling flexible funding call</li> <li>• Seed funding for a piece of work that could lead to responsive mode applications</li> <li>• Work that can be used (e.g. a feasibility study) to establish a principle / understand the challenges for a larger bid to other sources of CCS funding later</li> <li>• The following areas are considered out of scope for the UKCCSRC flexible funds: CCU projects that do not include mineralisation or equivalent in terms of storage longevity, and Sustainable Aviation Fuel (SAF) that does not include CCS</li> </ul> <p>The call is an open call to anyone eligible for EPSRC funding and Early Career Researchers.</p>
3. What involvement and consultation has been done in relation to this policy? 4. Who is affected by the policy/funding activity/event?	<p>The Carbon Capture and Storage academic community will benefit from this funding, along with the industries whose research needs have been addressed through the selected proposals.</p>
5. What are the arrangements for monitoring and reviewing the actual impact of the policy/funding activity/event?	<p>The outputs and impacts of the funded projects will be monitored by the UKCCSRC Secretariat and published on the UKCCSRC website, through its series of events as well as on Researchfish.</p> <p>The assessment process is an independent process run by the UKCCSRC Centre Manager along with the UKCCSRC Board. Assessments are completed by independent reviewers reporting directly to the Board.</p>

For policy changes, funding activities and events UKCCSRC will aim to:

- Select venues that are accessible and, where possible, accommodate any specific requirements in our planning and organisation of an initiative to support wider participation. This includes for applicants, reviewers, panel members and staff. Included in the interview invitation letter will be a request for any access issues to be notified.
- All participants in the process are asked to inform staff if they have any additional needs to enable attendance or participation.
- Clearly communicate the timeline and key milestones for funding activities, advertise these widely to reach the largest possible audience.
- Support and encourage panel members to follow best practice in taking positive steps to safeguard funding decisions. Staff will work closely with the Panel Chair(s) to agree approaches that are designed to minimise opportunities for bias and improve transparency of the decision-making process. This includes managing environmental conditions, such as providing appropriate breaks.
- Support flexible working of stakeholders.
- Ensure diversity of peer review assessment and interview panels. Staff will adhere to a mixed panel policy and endeavour to achieve the minimum 30% for the underrepresented gender on the panel.
- Abide by the principles of peer review.
- Handle personal sensitive information in compliance with General Data Protection Regulation 2018.
